ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 90-5

Pursuant to Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure 3.130(a) and Florida Rules of Judicial Administration 2.050(b)(2), (3), and (4), the Circuit and County Judges are designated to be available for first appearances and proceedings in all of the Counties of the Circuit utilizing the following procedures.

1. For First Appearances a schedule of rotation for judges shall be prepared by the judges in each County or at the direction of the Chief Judge if no agreement can be reached. Judges may trade duty or accept responsibility for another judges duty. Should any judge be unavailable for his assignment duty, it shall be his responsibility to contact another judge to be available.

2. On Monday through Friday, except Holidays juvenile detention and shelter care hearings will be assigned to the Circuit or County Judges assigned juvenile cases in each county unless a specific assignment states otherwise.

3. The Circuit and County Judges residing in St. Lucie County are assigned to conduct detention hearings for all of the cases arising in any county of the Circuit on Saturday, Sunday and Holidays of each week on a rotating basis. By agreement any Circuit or County Judge may assist or substitute for the Judges of St. Lucie County at any time.



4. For the purpose of convenience to all concerned the weekend and Holiday Judge assigned to first appearances in each county will be deemed to be the duty Judge and is assigned to all first appearance, shelter care or any Circuit or County emergency matter that is brought to the courts attention from 5:00 P.M. Friday to 8:00 A.M. Monday or 5:00 P.M. the day before a holiday period to 8:00 A.M. the day after a holiday period.

This Order revokes paragraph 2 of Administrative Order 84-2 and is in addition to Administrative Order 85-6.

The effective date of this Order is November 1, 1990.
