RE: AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT OF 1990

AMENDED
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 93-01

WHEREAS, the Court having been advised by the office of State Courts Administrator that each agency involved with the Court System is responsible for naming an Americans with Disabilities Coordinator responsible for making arrangements to accommodate any person with a disability receiving a summons from the issuing agency,

THEREFORE ORDERS:

1). Each Clerk of Court, State Attorney Office, Public Defender Office and Law Enforcement agency shall name an Americans with Disabilities Act Coordinator.

2). The Americans with Disabilities Act Statement required by Administrative Order 93-01 is voided. Each agency issuing Juror or Witness summons shall develop a statement to be printed on each summons to inform an individual with a disability requiring special accommodations how to obtain those accommodations from their agency.

An appropriate example meeting the ADA requirements is as follows:

"In accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act, Persons with a disability needing special accommodations to participate in this proceeding should contact (the name of your ADA Coordinator) not later than seven days prior to the proceeding at (your address). Telephone: (your area code and number); 1-800-955-8771 (TDD), or 1-800-955-8770 (V), via Florida Relay Service."

3). Each Americans with Disabilities (ADA) Coordinator may consult with the Court Administrators office as to their agencies compliance with ADA implementation.

This Order shall be effective July 1, 1993.
