ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 93-04


Pursuant to Chief Justice Barkett's Order of March 8, 1993, requiring each Chief Judge to notify the Chief Justice monthly of all cases still under advisement after 120 days and pursuant to Rule 2.050 (f), Florida Rules of Judicial Administration, the following procedures are to be followed and will be effective June 1, 1993.

1). All Circuit and County Judges are to notify the Court Administrator's Office, by the Fifth (5) day of each month of cases under advisement for more than sixty (60) calendar days.

2). The procedure for notifying the Court Administrator's Office shall include sending a tracking form on a monthly basis listing the case name, case number and time under advisement.

3). The Chief Judge of the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit will be notified by the Court Administrator's Office of all cases that are held under advisement for more than two (2) calendar months without an Order or Judgement.
