SECOND AMENDED
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 93-05

IN RE: RECORDING OF COURT PROCEEDINGS IN CAPITAL CASES OF
MURDER IN THE FIRST DEGREE OR OF A CAPITAL FELONY UNDER
FLORIDA STATUTE 789.161 (DESTRUCTIVE DEVICES)

Pursuant to 2.070(c)(1), Rules of Judicial Administration, as Chief Judge I deem it
appropriate to order:

Court reporters shall be used in the above-styled cases in addition to the electronic or
video recordings. In indigency cases, the use of court reporters shall be limited to the plea,
trial and the sentencing phases of these proceedings unless the presiding judge determines it
necessary for other types of proceedings and motions.

The presiding judge shall determine in each particular case, whether the transcripts of
the proceedings in these cases shall be prepared by the court reporter or prepared with the use
of electronic or video recording.


In each proceeding, it shall be the responsibility in these cases of the State Attorney or
Assistant State Attorney assigned to the particular case, to secure attendance of the court
reporter at each stage of the proceeding where the court reporter is mandatorily required.

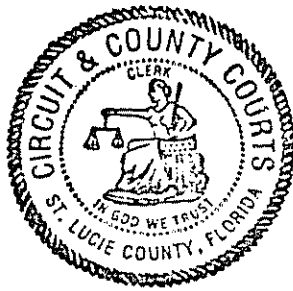
Court reporters are mandatorily required to attend and appear at the plea, trial and
sentencing phases of the proceedings in the above-styled cases. Transcripts by the court
reporter or court transcriber from the electronic or video recordings shall be promptly

prepared in a reasonable time upon order of the presiding judge.


