ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

NO. 95-4

In order to improve the administration of justice within Martin and St. Lucie Counties, Nineteenth Judicial Circuit and pursuant to the provisions of Section 370.061(1), Florida Statutes, and Article X Section 16 of the Constitution of the State of Florida, it is here with.

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED:


1. When any gill net, trammel net, stab net or other entangling net, is found unattended in or upon the waters of the State within Martin and St. Lucie Counties, and the identity of the identity of said net is not readily ascertainable, said net is declared to be a nuisance and is forfeited to the State of Florida, Department of Environmental Protection, Division of Law Enforcement.

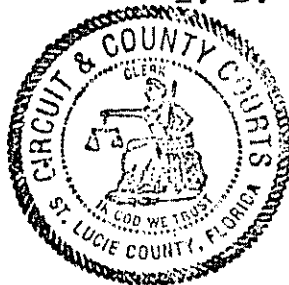
2. Said net may be destroyed or otherwise disposed of according to Law.

3. This order shall take effect immediately and shall remain in effect until further order of this Court.


